Explanation:

The Annual General Meeting of Men's Shed North Shore Trust was held on Sunday, May 7th as notified. Thank you to all who attended.

Unfortunately we did not have the required number of members for a quorum. We needed 20 members at the meeting but only 15 members attended.

The meeting was unofficially conducted according to the agenda with the Chairman's, Treasurer's, and Membership Director's reports being delivered and provisional Trustee nominations accepted with no contrary votes.

The outcome of the meeting held May 7th has no standing or impact because not enough members attended.

To rectify this situation it has been necessary to call a Special General Meeting of the Men's Shed North Shore Trust and the requisite minimum 10 members have signified their agreement that the meeting should be held.

At this meeting the Chairman's, Treasurer's and Member Director's reports will be presented and voted on as will the annual vote on the appointment of the Board of Trustees.

It is important that as many members as possible attend this meeting. It is necessary that we have a quorum of 20 members. It is vital to the long term stability of The Shed that all our members be aware of what and how we are doing, as well as our plans for the future.

The meeting will be held in the lunch room at The Shed and will be followed by the regular monthly barbeque lunch.


Community Repair Café

The community Repair Café was held at the Birkenhead Primary School on 6th May.

Trevor, Bernard and his wife Sonia attended to help out on behalf of the Men's Shed. It was an interesting 3 hours with people from the community bringing in broken articles to have them repaired or be shown how to repair them, if possible while they watched.

There were some interesting things brought in. An upright oil filled heater which did not work was found to have been assembled upside down and the roll-over mechanism trashed. There was a toaster in which about 200 grams of crumbs and a dead cricket were found. A drone which would not work was found to have three half charged batteries and one dead one. The guys were told after all the testing that the batteries were used for several different things. A leaking jug was brought in by someone who thought some sort of glue might fix it. What glue would fix an electric jug with a heat contact plastic level indicator to stick to a plastic body jug? They did a repair on a small wooden table, a power cord, a vacuum cleaner, a hearing aid humidifier and two other toasters, but could not get two microwaves going which were not only rusty inside, but one had the wave plate on the side completely melted. In all it was a fun three hours for everyone, The sewing ladies were quite busy and the bike guys did not stop. They had a continuous run of repairs and checks.
