# House Keeping

## *Workshop Safety*

There have been several concerns raised recently regarding safety in the workshops.

### **Please note:**

- Eye Protection must be worn at all times when using any machinery or power tool. (squinting is not regarded as eye protection!)
- Hearing Protection must be worn when using or near noisy power tools or machinery.
- Closed toed footwear must be worn at all times - no sandals Jandals etc.
- It is also recommended that you wear protection against dust when sanding etc. (Or near any machine that is producing dust) The fibres of some timbers and MDF can be harmful when inhaled.
- Eye, Hearing and Breathing Protection is supplied for Members to use. If in doubt, ask a Trustee

If you are in any doubt as to how to use any machine safely, ask a Trustee.

It is every Member's responsibility to ensure that they follow safe practises at all time, for their own protection and the safety of others.

- All tools must be treated with respect and not used for any purpose other than that for which they are intended.
